



Thurlstone Primary School Coronavirus (Covid-19) Catch-Up Premium Grant

How the school is spending the money:

The school was allocated £14,400 by the government. This money is ring fenced and will be spent on providing high quality teaching support to enable identified children to make rapid gains in their learning following the spring and summer lockdown of 2020. The wellbeing needs of children will also be supported.

The school has spent the money in the following ways:

- to provide small groups and 1 to 1 academic and/or wellbeing support from a qualified teacher for Reception and KS1 for half a day each week, on top of the support they are already getting in school. This teacher is highly skilled at supporting Reception and KS1 pupils in particular
- to provide small group and 1 to 1 academic and wellbeing support from a qualified teacher, who is also Thrive trained, for two days a week. This teacher is highly skilled at supporting KS2 pupils in particular.

Both 'catch-up' teachers are working closely with class teachers to plan and assess the progress made by the children. The teachers will provide this level of support until the end of the spring term.

Teachers will assess the progress made by the children on an ongoing basis and adjust plans accordingly.
