## A SUMMARY OF AREAS FOR DEVELOPMENT AND OUR RESPONSE:

- Explore site security this has already been raised and is currently in the hands of the Local Authority and should be actioned soon.
- More construction in the FS outdoor learning area we'll have a look and see what is needed.
- **Keep on increasing sports for all abilities and after school clubs** as P4Sport grows, so will sporting opportunities. We urge children to join in more with the after school events at PGS on Thursdays. We have a wide range of after school clubs which will vary over the course of the year. We are limited to how many we can offer due to availability of staff.
- P4Sport events on different days- Thursday is the only day that Mr Foster is employed to organise and carry out P4Sport
  events.
- Please put the Shuttle on the website or online somewhere so if it's lost we can download it good idea! We'll do that!
- **Mandatory homework in Y2** we try to provide a balance for our families when it comes to homework. We prefer children to focus on basic skills so that they can be mastered. Reading is of high importance to us as a homework task.
- To be able to watch the guitar gig at Christmas as my child practiced so hard yes this is a good idea. We'll make sure parents are invited from now on.
- More outdoor provision; the dens are lovely but could there be more for them to explore- there are plans in place to develop the old nature area. Work will be taking place in the spring as weather improves. If anyone would like to help, just ask.
- Equipment out at break times we have done this is the past, unfortunately equipment gets broken and mistreated and school cannot afford to replace things as frequently as needed. We do have some equipment that is used in the warmer months.
- We would like to see more P.E/Sports choices- children have 2 P.E lessons each week and many sports are covered over the course of the year. P4Sport provides opportunities for all ages to participate in a wide range of sports and after school and during school time.
- What's happened to the plastic bottle wall that was planned? Miss Little was in charge of the Eco-brick project so this job will be taken on by another member of staff after Easter.
- More outside events that bring other surrounding schools together We have some exciting events planned that will tick this box in the summer term.
- Ideas about how we can support our child with phonics and numbers we'll discuss this in a staff meeting soon.
- My child has missed running club We'll look at how we can get running club back on to the after school club timetable.
- Improve the outside play sections we would love to make further improvements, however our budget remains tight so improvements have to be funded by fundraising and PTA activities and this takes time. We have some plans in place for the old allotment area which should be starting to take shape in the spring and summer terms.
- Could Special Mentions parents be made aware earlier? We understand that for some more notice would be better, however children are chosen for a Special Mention based upon their week in school, so when choosing the children need to have as much of the week under their belt as possible.
