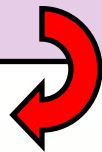
We already have quite a bit of lost property building up in school. PLEASE ensure belongings are CLEARLY LABELLED with names (not initials). THANK YOU

COULD YOUR CHILD BE ENTITLED TO FREE SCHOOL MEALS? You will qualify if you receive:

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit with an annual income of less than £16,190, provided you are not receiving Working Tax Credit
- the 'guaranteed' element of the State Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Universal Credit with an annual net earned income threshold of less than £7400 support under part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.

If your child's eligible, you could save up to £400 a year with free school meals. You'll also be able to access the [Healthy Holidays](#) programme during some school holidays.

Your child's school will also be provided with additional funding.
